OUR PASTOR CHATS

We are in the Christian season of Easter which is 50 days long. One day is not long enough to celebrate and remember Christ is risen and lives today. One day was also not enough to send the disciples forth with the good news into all of the world. During this time we remember Jesus appeared to the disciples over a period of 40 days, ascended, and sent the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. Those 50 days were filled with time with Jesus, going from doubt to faith (think of Thomas), reconciliation (Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me?"), dealing with fear (there were a lot of doors locked out of fear in those early days!), and waiting for the power Jesus would give in the Holy Spirit.

God knows that people take a long investment of time to build up in the faith, hope, and love of Jesus Christ. One day or a few is plenty long for many tasks, even Christian ministry: making food and taking it to someone in need, recovering from surgery, or mourning; preparing a Bible lesson or sermon; organizing a mission or fellowship event. The 50 days of Easter were a longer period of immersion into the presence and stories of the risen Christ and waiting to be filled with the gifts and power of the Holy Spirit for Christian living and ministry.

Easter being 50 days instead of just one can be a sign that Jesus makes the time to build up disciples. These 50 days can also remind us to open our lives to the risen Christ to build us up in Christian living and service. They can also challenge us to work alongside the risen Christ in making generous amounts of time for allowing the kingdom of God to penetrate the hearts, thinking, and commitments of disciples and those first learning about Jesus. Christ is risen! Christ is raising up Easter people to share the good news of life in Jesus. Raise us up in grace, risen Christ.

We have received word from Rev Don Hawks who maintains the KUMC website that it has been hacked and will be unavailable for some time. Let us give thanks for Don's website gifts and pray grace for him and he takes up the challenge of working through the hacked website. WE RETURN AND A BABY'S VOICE IS HEARD. A heart with the words of Psalm 51:10 shown on the video screen, and "Standing on the Promises", played on the organ by Carol Sacra, was heard as church family gathered once again in the Lord's house on Mar 21st. The church bell rang, and Carol played "Meditation of the Lord is My Shepherd", and Leah Siler brought in the Light of Christ. Pastor Joel gave a warm welcome to all that had returned and commented that Lynn was excited to be making a bulletin for worship after a year of none. All were asked to stand for the opening prayer, "A Collect for the 5th Sunday in Lent"; and then to join in saying the words to "And Are We Yet Alive" as Carol played the hymn on the organ. Wherever there is misery Jesus is there. Look around you for those who need Jesus, and take up the cross Jesus has for you. Prayers for the people, and the Lord's Prayer followed the message. <u>DILLARD CELEBRITIES IN THE DNR</u>: On April 1st, an article in the DNR entitled "A Year of Virtual Learning Brings Out Resilience" by Megan Williams, featured our very own Dillard family, with a picture of Leigha sitting at the dining room table on her computer and Jenny giving an interview. Paraphrasing Jenny's words, Scott continued to work as usual when the pandemic hit, but her work stopped at the preschool. This gave her the blessing of being at home with Leigha and Haiden, taking on the challenge of academics, in which they both did well, but struggling with the social aspect, especially for Leigha, a Senior, missing her peers, but growing more independent. It was a no-win situation, but school divisions, whether virtual or in-person, kept the learning moving forward. We weren't nearly as affected as many, according to Jenny. Great job, Jenny and Leigha!

MAUNDAY THURSDAY: It was a cold evening, April 1st. The wind was blowing, and the



snow flurried over us as we sat in the church garden, as if to remind us of the doom that Jesus was to tell us that night as we dined with Him and He washed our feet. It made one think of Peter warming himself by the fire at the home of Caiaphas the night before Jesus died, or wonder more about Jesus exposed to the cold. Tanya read

from John 13 and Mark 14, the stories of the Passover meal, the washing of the disciples' feet, the revealing of the traitor, communion, and Jesus

praying in the garden to do God's will. We ate the wafer and drank the juice in remembrance, and we prayed. We sang praises to Him with "Jesu, Jesu" and remembered the total Easter story as we sang "Go to Dark Gethsemane". We departed, remembering, and blessed.

GOOD FRIDAY: This evening, April 2nd, as we sat in front of the cross with its black shroud, our thoughts were led to the last seven sayings of Jesus: "(1) Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. (2) Today you will be with me in paradise. (3) Woman, behold, thy son! Behold, thy

will be with me in paradise. (3) Woman, behold, thy son! Behold, thy mother! (4) My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? (5) I thirst. (6) It is finished. (7) Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit." After scriptures passages from Luke, John, and Psalms were



read, we also sang "O Love What Hast Thou Done?", "Remember Me", and "Were You There?" to help us remember the suffering, the crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus. We need to believe, and be thankful, that Jesus knows us in our suffering, and that He loved each of us so much that His words were "not my will, but thine be done".

EASTER SUNRISE: April 4th, Easter morning was another cold day, but the sun broke



thru over the mountain and the warmth of Jesus filled our hearts as we stood in the Keezletown Cemetery and welcomed the resurrection of our Lord, with prayers and singing. Pastor Joel spoke on "Seeking Jesus, Found by Jesus" from John 20:1-18, the story of

Mary and the disciples finding the empty tomb, talking with the angels, and spreading the word that Jesus arose from the dead and lives. We sang "Low in the Grace He Lay" and "He Rose" to celebrate His resurrection. He Lives and I am Forgiven—Hallelujah!

HE IS RISEN INDEED! Beautiful Easter music was being played by Carol Sacra and MaKenna Eppard as we entered the lily and tulip filled sanctuary on Easter morning, April 4th, and the bell rang. Our hearts soared as Carol played the ever-beautiful "Holy

City", as many hummed and mouthed the words "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, lift up your gates and sing, Hosanna in the highest, Hosanna to our King", as Ryan brought in the Light of Christ. What a grand way to start the service. Carol Dillard, adorned in her Easter hat, assisted Pastor Joel and gave the greeting, as well as a brief testimony about remembering Easters past, in her own childhood, and the childhood of her boys. She reminded us of God's promise in John 3:16, that He will love us no matter how unlovable we can be, and that by believing we will have eternal life with Him. A responsive Call to Worship preceded hearing and reading the hymn "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today". Mary Nankivell recited, via video, three of her Easter stories: "Troublemaker", "Three Rusty Nails", and "Sandals". The Gospel lesson was read by Haiden from Mark 16:1-14, 19-20, the women go to the tomb, speak with the angels, and



Jesus appears. Pastor Joel then spoke on "Let Jesus Live" by beginning with the crucifixion and the resurrection are not the end of the good news of Jesus Christ—we have a living Savior. Let Jesus live in you, in your faith, and in your relationships. The Gospel of Mark was added to, after the women left the tomb afraid to speak, but the addition shows us that Jesus' good news

never ends. The faithful women followers were there for Jesus, even to the end. Now we let Jesus live by the love and dignity of Jesus in our relationships because of what He has done for everyone. Jesus heals, speaks, forgives, takes our burdens, lifts us up, and welcomes all to God. Will we let Jesus live? Carol then lead all in an Affirmation of Faith from 1 Corinthians 15:1-6 and Colossians 1:14-20. Pastor Joel gave an Invitation to Communion and led the Confession and Pardon, followed by the Offertory Prayer. The great Thanksgiving was read, followed by the Lord's Prayer. All were asked to take the Bread and Cup with them and either share outside or at home. He then gave the blessing and all departed as Ryan carried out the Light of Christ and Carol played "Because He Lives" as the postlude. **WILL YOU LET JESUS LIVE?**

interpretive dance as she sang. Neil came to read the Gospel lesson from John 20:19-31, Jesus appearing to the disciples and again to Thomas. Our guest speaker, and Church family member, Ken Thomas then spoke on "No Doubt", by beginning with a story about a little boy seeing a plaque of persons dying during their service. He asked the Pastor, "Which service, the 9 or 11?" Ken promised not to bore us to death. The Disciples were hiding and afraid. Jesus came to them and said "Peace be with you" and showed them His hands and sides, but Thomas was not with them, and when he was told, he did not believe, but doubted until he could see for himself. Later when they were again meeting, and Thomas was there, Jesus appeared again and showed Thomas His hands and side. Thomas said, "My Lord and my God". Jesus asked him, "Do you believe because you see? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." He filled the disciples with the Holy Spirit and allowed them to forgive sins. A man walked along a path overlooking a cliff one dark evening. He fell off the path and grabbed a root sticking out as he fell. He pleaded with God to save him and God answered, "Let go of the root". The man asked if he could speak to someone else. How much faith do we have—let go of the root. Ken said, "My name is Thomas, but I believe that Jesus came, was crucified, died, was buried, and rose again, for my sins and your sins. I cannot let go of the root, but I know who is waiting at the bottom when I fall." We then hummed "Blessed Assurance", followed by Ken leading the prayer time and the Lord's Prayer. Pastor Joel led the offertory prayer, before we hummed "Victory in Jesus" as our closing hymn. Pastor Joel gave the blessing, Haiden carried out the Light of Christ, and Diana played "Jesus Loves Me" as the postlude. LET GO OF THE ROOT!
