Small Group or personal study

Read 1 John 3:1-10

- When reading a passage of scripture we often have to read it in context (with the text around it). Reading the Bible in context can mean reading a passage in light of the whole book it is a part of and within the whole text of the Bible. As Christians we particularly read scripture in the light of Jesus Christ. Look at 1 John 3:4-9 and what it says about us and sin. How do you interpret it?
- Now read 1 John 1:6-10. What does this passage say about us and sin? How is it different or the same as 1 John 3:4-9?
- Notice the actions of God in 1 John 1:5-10 and 3:1-10. Jesus forgives and cleanses from sin as we confess our sins. Jesus has come to destroy sin and make us the children of God empowered by God to grow in our understanding and actions to be more and more like Jesus. Forgiveness and being a child of God in these passages are actions of God. Have you allowed God to forgive you and make you a child of God?
  - How have you done that?
  - What is holding you back from allowing God to make you more like Jesus?
- What would it be like to take a nametag and write on it "Child of God" and wear that around? What would it mean for you claim God's grace for you? How would it influence how you treat others displaying that you are a child of God?
- What would it be like to imagine other people of faith in Christ as wearing a name tag that reads "Child of God"? How would being under the same grace, salvation, and presence of Jesus Christ impact your relationship?
