Small Group or personal study

Read Mark 4:26-34

• Parables are stories Jesus shares to teach about what the kingdom of God is like. Parables also have surprises in them. One surprise in verses 26-29 is that the kingdom of God grows without our understanding or even managing every aspect of it. Yet, we are still a part of it in planting, working, and harvesting in that parable. What do you not understand about how the kingdom of God grows?

• How have you seen the kingdom of God grow without your managing every detail of it?

• One thing reflected in the parable in verses 26-29 (and the scriptures in general) is that God's work, salvation, and grace bring the kingdom of God. How does it make you feel that God is at work to bring the kingdom in ways we don't fully understand and can't manage?

• The second parable of the mustard seed in verses 30-32 has one surprise of the kingdom of God being compared to a tiny seed. A second surprise is the unexpected growth of the mustard bush that becomes big enough to supports nests for birds. What aspects of the kingdom of God seem very small to you, easy to lose, maybe hard to see?

• How have you seen something of the kingdom of God begin small but grow enough to give people shade, shelter, and peace in Jesus Christ?

• In the mustard seed parable the kingdom of God is planted. What small seed of Jesus Christ is the Holy Spirit moving you plant this week in your life or the life of someone else?
