Read Mark 6:1-13

- Nazareth was the hometown of Jesus where he had grown up. Jesus taught in the hometown synagogue, spoke to people, and healed a few sick people. Jesus brought the grace of God right to the community he grew up in. How are you following Jesus in sharing the grace of God in the community you call home now?

- Jesus was amazed at the unbelief in his hometown. Jesus was familiar to them as “carpenter, Mary’s son, brother of James, Joses, Judas, Simon, and his sister” (v. 3). They were offended by the wisdom and power of God in Jesus. Jesus appeared as the human they had grown up with who was sharing the grace of God. When we appear to be people where we live, they will often see our place, history, and roles in the community. It may be difficult for people to recognize God’s grace coming through us. Though Jesus was rejected many times, Jesus continued to share grace. When you are rejected, what will help you continue to share the grace, ministry, and good news of God?

- We can certainly also be like people in Jesus’ hometown. When have you been offended at someone you knew sharing the things of God because you thought it was not their place, or role, or privilege to do so?

- Jesus appointed 12 disciples (followers) to be apostles (sent ones) in Mark 3:13-19. In today’s passage Jesus sent those 12 out with his authority. Those apostles would not only tell

others what they had seen but they would share the ministry of Jesus themselves by proclaiming repentance of sins, casting out demons, and healing the sick. Throughout the scriptures God does not only invite humanity to see what God can do. God empowers humanity to partner with God in God's actions. How are you opening your faith to see what Jesus Christ is doing around you in the Word, Church, and people around you? How is God empowering you to join in sharing the saving actions of Jesus Christ?
