OUR PASTOR CHATS

I would like to share a prayer with you for you to consider praying in the new year. It is a radical prayer. It is the kind of prayer of giving everything to God. It is certainly not to be prayed lightly. It is a prayer that always stops me in my tracks when I have begun to pray it in a routine fashion. The deep trust in God in this prayer shakes me awake every time and confronts me with the question, "Am I ready to trust Jesus with all things and give my life to Jesus?" Here is a little about where this prayer comes from. John Wesley and the early Methodists observed the New Year by renewing their covenant with God in what were called Watch Night Services since they were often on New Year's Eve. The service could last three hours or longer as it made ample space with scripture, prayer, singing, and preaching for those gathered to prepare and be ready to renew their faith in God. There is a prayer that comes from those services and you can find it in The United Methodist Hymnal #607 and it is titled "A Covenant Prayer in the Wesleyan Tradition." There are some Christians who are so fond of this prayer and find it so beneficial, they pray it every day to help live their faith in Jesus Christ. I have been blessed by this prayer, too, and always take time to pray it in the new year. I share it with you again at the beginning of the year as one way you may renew your commitment to God. "I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen". May God give us grace that we may pray with great faith. Pastor Toel

UNITED METHODIST MEN'S SUNDAY: We were blessed on Sunday, Nov 13th to have the men of KUMC lead the worship service. Carol Sacra played the gathering music of "Just a Closer Walk with Thee", "My Jesus, As Thou Wilt", and "Savior, Source of Every Blessing". The bell rang, Pastor Joel gave the Worship preparation, and Carol played "Autumn Song" as the prelude, as Chloe Robinette and Haiden Dillard carried in the Light of Christ. Scott Dillard, UMM President, gave the Morning greeting, the Opening Prayer, and asked all to Pass the Peace, followed by the singing of "To God Be the Glory". Dale Dodrill led the Children's

Twelve men's voices brought smiles to the faces of the congregation as they sang "Rise Up O Men of God", followed by much applause and shouts of "encore!". The Old Testament Lesson was from Joshua 24:14-15, choose who you will serve. Scott Dillard then introduced today's speaker, Charles Sargent, who spoke on "Time to Make a Choice". He began by thanking the men for standing up in church. History is important; the people of the Bible left a memorial for what God left in their lives. The way you live is your memorial. God hand picks people for certain jobs. Joshua means God's salvation. He knew God; he listened and led. We serve a powerful God—never limit Him. We need to study the word of God. There are promises in the Bible that are ours if we claim them. We need to choose who we serve. The arm of flesh will fail you. Think about whose side you are on. Choose to serve the Lord and let the Son set you free. The singing of "Crown Him With Many Crowns" followed the message. Leonard Williams then led the Morning prayer and the Lord's Prayer. Special guest, Captain Duane Burleigh, then gave a witness (see next item), before the Offering was collected, the Doxology sung, and the offertory prayer given by Neil Sacra. The closing hymn was "It Is Well With My Soul", before Josh Wanger gave the benediction, Haiden carried out the Light of Christ, and Carol closed with "Rise Up O Men of God". SALVATION ARMY WITNESS: Captain Duane Burleigh visited with us on UMM Sunday



and spoke about his return to the Valley after being away since 2014, and how glad he was to be back. The Salvation Army is now fully renovated and open, with 38 guests. They help those who want help, but at Christmas, lots of help is needed, for ringing bells, buying gifts for the angel trees, and packing the angel bags for distribution. This year they will serve 681 families at Christmas, that's

almost 1500 children. He was grateful to see KUMC's angel tree, because he knows that we are a community that cares about others.

<u>United Methodist Men</u> had their monthly gathering on Sunday, Nov 20th with 11 in attendance, beginning with a wonderful breakfast prepared by Scott Dillard, including venison prepared by Scott Dodrill, which was enjoyed by all. Scott then led the men in a time of prayer for Ken and Faye Hoover-Thomas as they are dealing with health issues and her latest injury. Ken and Faye are a big part of our church family, and Ken is so very dedicated to the Men's group. We also prayed for others from our group who were unable to attend as they also are dealing with their own health issues as well. Scott Dillard led a devotional on the 10 lepers in which only one returned to give thanks to God. We discussed the importance as followers of God who receive the many blessings and gifts from God, but in order to be made whole we must go to God, give thanks with gratitude and grace. During the business portion of our gathering, the minutes were reviewed from our Oct gathering as well as a Treasurer's report given and approved. Many of the logistics of the Men's group serving the UWF group on Thursday, Dec. 1st at 6:30 p.m. was worked out. A signup sheet for the annual Christmas Dinner at Blessing Lodge was passed

around to get a head count. The Men's group will not meet in Dec as many things are going on with the group and their families during the holiday season. Our next meeting will be Jan 15th, 2023. Chairman Dillard asked for and received volunteers for fixing breakfast and giving the devotion for that gathering.

INVISIBLE OR VISIBLE GOD? Nov 20th was Christ the King Sunday and worship began with Chris playing "We Gather Together", "Come, Ye Thankful People Come", "Shine, Jesus, Shine", and "Majesty, Worship His Majesty" as we gathered, and the bell rang. Pastor Joel gave the welcome before Chris played "All Hail King Jesus" as the prelude and Haiden carried in the Light of Christ. He then gave the morning welcome, announcements, and led the Psalter, Psalms 100, and the prayer "Christ the King", before asking all to Pass the Peace. Our first hymn was "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise", followed by Lynn Siler leading the Children's Time as she talked about and dedicated the shoebox collection. The choir then sang "Give Thanks". Randy Clatterbuck came to read the Epistle Lesson from Colossians 1:11-20, the invisible God. Pastor Joel spoke on "Jesus: Making God Visible" and began that Paul and Timothy wrote that Jesus is the image of the invisible God. We are crazy about Jesus. There is no clear image of God other than Jesus coming down. Sometimes we see ourselves, we see our sin, selfishness, and pettiness, when we compare ourselves to Jesus. The Bible is full of God descriptions that tell us a little bit of what He is like, but not everything. Jesus Christ is the image of the invisible God. We hear about what God does, we have the Bible, but until you experience Jesus, you do not know God. He is the only one who can fill us for eternity; God is a relationship. Jesus holds everything together. In the Advent devotional, we share Jesus with others, we make Him visible to others. The singing of "Open My Eyes, That I May See" followed the message. Pastor Joel then led the Morning prayer and the Lord's Prayer, followed by the Giving of our Offerings as Chris played "Now Thank We All Our God", and the Doxology. Pastor Joel gave the offertory prayer before we sang the final hymn, "Victory in Jesus". He then gave the benediction as Haiden carried out the Light of Christ and Chris played "Rejoice, the Lord is King". SHARE AND MAKE HIM VISIBLE TO OTHERS.

Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes: It's that time of the year when Christmas is just around the corner. The Church family was asked to fill a box or more with toys, hygiene items, school supplies, etc., to send to a child for Christmas and share God's love. These shoeboxes were collected and dedicated. Along with the church family, the Massanutten Presbyterian Preschool class, and others, we were able to take 112 shoeboxes to the

<u>"Twelve Women of the Bible" study</u> met at 10:00 a.m. on Nov 21st with 12 women present and Pastor Joel leading. Our video was presented by Lysa Terkeurst and focused on the woman at the well with no name. Lysa led us thru the story of how the Samaritan woman was approached by Jesus, a Jew, who asked for water, then told her He could give her living water. Her conversion led to many others. What do we try to hide from Jesus?

<u>DECORATING THE CHURCH</u>: After Bible Study on the morning of Nov 21st, the ladies of the class, along with Pastor Joel, Darryl Eppard, and Mike Summers went about bringing down the

wreaths, trees, and decorations for the church for Christmas. HANGING OF THE GREENS SUNDAY: What a difference it makes when you walk into the sanctuary and it's decorated for Christmas, with the wreaths and poinsettias. Carol helped us prepare for worship on Nov 27th by playing "People Look East", "Nazareth", and "Poinsettias", before the ringing of the bell, and Cathy giving the worship preparation. She then played "Chanson de Noel" as lovely little Nora Grace came in looking like a little angel carrying the Light of Christ. Cathy came to welcome everyone and give the announcements, before Neil read the Gospel lesson from Matthew 1:1-3a; 5-6; 16-17, the lineage of Jesus. Pastor Joel spoke on the "Child of Promise", a king coming during Advent. Matthew's birth stories introduce us to Jesus as the promises fulfilled in the Old Testament. At the beginning of Advent, we need to see that Jesus is never done with us. Christ means the anointed one, the promised one. David was promised that the Messiah would come. A new time came when Jesus was born, a new beginning. This means the kingdom keeps growing and will have no end. God was and is faithful throughout the generations. God includes all who hear His call. Today we make the church ready to welcome Jesus. Listen to the promises during the Hanging of the Greens, and adorn your hearts, your lives, and your homes with God, by sharing His love with others. The choir then presented "The King of Glory Comes". A responsive "Introduction to the Hanging of the Greens" was led by Cathy, followed by the Guilliams family presenting God Will Send a Righteous King, from Jeremiah 23:5-6 and placing the cedar branch on the altar. We then sang "People Look East". The Mitchell family presented the Prophet Declares a Child Will be Born from Isaiah 9:2, 6-7, and placed the evergreen wreaths in the windows as we sang "All Earth Is Waiting". The Mason/Jarrells family presented the Fourth Servant Song from Isaiah 53:1-6, and placed the holly and the ivy on the altar as the choir sang "Deck the Halls". The Scott Dillard family presented the Mystery of the Incarnation from John 1:1-5, 9-14, and blessed and lit the Chrismon tree, as the choir sang "O Christmas Tree". Josh Shifflett presented the Blessing of the Nativity (made and set up by the Scott Dodrill family), and we sang "The Friendly Beasts". Pastor Joel presented the Legend of the Poinsettias and the choir sang "What Can I Give Him". The Sprague family gave the Blessing of the Advent Wreath, a responsive reading, and the lighting of the First Advent Candle reading, as the candle was lit. We then sang "O Come, O Come Emmanuel". With the blessings all completed, Cathy led the morning prayer and the Lord's prayer. Linda Liskey then remined all that Jesus had nothing when He was born, but that we are able now to help newborns and their mothers. She asked all to remember the Baby Shower for Jesus being collected at the Christmas Eve service. As Carol played "Vignette", the

offering was collected, followed by the Doxology and Cathy's offertory prayer.
