A Collect for Thanksgiving Day from The Book of Common Prayer, 1979

Almighty and gracious Father, we give you thanks for the fruits of the earth in their season and for the labors of those who harvest them. Make us, we pray, faithful stewards of your great bounty, for the provision of our necessities and the relief of all who are in need, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Small Group or Personal Study

- Read Philippians 4:10-23.
- In this season of Thanksgiving it is a great time to give thanks to God and to thank people for the blessings they have given us. Write a thank you card or share a thank you with someone this week. A way to do so like Paul did, would be to point how someone's actions were to you like an offering to God that has brought God glory and made you give thanks to God.
- Paul writes about being content in all things. Paul shares he has learned how to be content no matter his circumstances. He has not found satisfaction or strength in himself or way of thinking, but in Jesus Christ. "I can do all things through him who strengthens me" (v. 13). What makes you content? Has Jesus been enough to make you content or do you need other things, too, and if so, what things?

- Psalm 23 is a contented kind of prayer. Psalm 23 does not reflect perfect circumstances but finding contentedness in God's presence and care in the image of a shepherd. Pray Psalm 23 today and spend a few minutes praying Psalm 23:1 and contemplating those words.
