# **OUR PASTOR CHATS**

The 2024 General Conference of the United Methodist Church will meet in Charlotte, North



Conference of the United Methodist Church will meet in Charlotte, North Carolina April 23 – May 3, 2024. This gathering usually happens every four years but has not met since 2019 due to COVID. Around 900 delegates from the United States, Africa, Europe, and the Philippines will gather for worship, prayer, fellowship, electing leaders, and legislating changes to *The Book of Discipline* and *The Book of Resolutions*. The legislative work of General Conference usually gets the most attention. Our Virginia Annual Conference has provided good resources and videos for learning about the upcoming

conference and you can access those materials at <u>https://vaumc.org/gc2024/</u>. Below are just some of the items that will be considered at the upcoming General Conference. (1) significant reductions in General Church Budget (43 percent possible); (2) a plan for Regionalization and allowing for a future global *Book of Discipline*; (3) increasing the mandatory retirement age from 72 for clergy; (4) revised social principles (some human sexuality issues included); (5) increasing the number of bishops in Africa where the church has been growing and reducing number of bishops in US (US disaffiliation and membership decline); (6) acts of apology and repentance for sexual abuse in the church; (7) acts of apology and repentance for the overthrow

of the Kingdom of Hawaii in 1893; (8) a petition to add "gender" to forms for nondiscrimination to the *Discipline*; (9) petitions for extending or expanding paths for disaffiliation like 2019 – 2023 such as allowing whole conferences to disaffiliate; (10) change to clergy retirement benefits from a defined benefit plan to a defined contribution plan; (11) consideration of document "Sent in Love: A United Methodist Understanding of Church"; (12) considering full communion with the Episcopal Church in the USA. The Upper Room has prepared a daily devotional *A Guide to Prayer for the United Methodist Church General Conference* and there are printouts available at KUMC. Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson and 22 delegates from our Virginia Annual Conference

Gathering Non-Perishable Food items: Drop off items at KUMC for our local food pantry. Non-perishable foods and hygiene items are welcome. The pantry is open 2nd Mondays from 10 - 11 AM and 2nd Thursdays from 7 – 8 PM.

Serving Meals to Kingsway Prison Ministry: Karen Mooney is leading preparing a meal each month for this ministry. Please contact her if you can help or donate.

US Disaster Response: For United States disaster relief designate your gift to "UMCOR US Disaster Response: Advance #901670." For international disasters please designate your gift to "UMCOR International Disaster Response: Advance #982450."

<u>Mission Central Equipment for Caring</u>: The medical equipment loaner closet loans out and receive donations of (1) durable medical equipment like hospital beds, wheelchairs, walkers, canes, bedside commodes, etc. and (2) disposable supplies like adult diapers, briefs, and wound care items. It is open Mondays 5 - 7 PM and Thursdays 9 - 11 AM. The location is Mt. Tabor UMC in Lacey Spring.

<u>Mission Central Children's Clothes Closet:</u> gives and receives donations of children's clothes including winter coats and shoes from sizes infant to 15 years old. New underwear, socks, and undergarments are also received. It is open  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Wednesday of each month from 10 AM – 1 PM;  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Thursdays of each month from 4 - 7 PM; and  $3^{rd}$  Tuesdays of each month from 4 - 7 PM.

Jenn was then recognized and thanked for her hard work in making the video process available for Sundays and other events. In Pastor Joel's report, he noted the death of Rosalie Harmon; the marriage of Gene and Carolyn Shockey; leading two Bible studies; the Lent Services; a Confirmation class; Rise Against Hunger; and preparing for Easter week. He also advised that John Nday has been given a new position. Pastor Joel still has three weeks of vacation before the end of June. With no further business, the meeting was adjourned. # HAPPY 3-16 DAY: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16

ST PATRICK'S DAY, MARCH 17<sup>th</sup>: An Irish blessing; "May the road rise up to meet you. May the wind be always at your back. May the sun shine warm upon your face, and rains fall soft upon your fields."

**ARE YOU A SERVANT?** On this, the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent, Mar 17<sup>th</sup>, Pastor Joel spoke from Mark 10:32-52 with a message entitled "The Servant of All". Jesus is the servant of all. Mark tries to tell us by showing how blind the disciples were and in the story of blind Bartimaeus. James and John want to sit on either side of Jesus in His glory; the other disciples got upset. Jesus tells them that in order to become what He is, they must pour out God's love, to serve, to be the servant of all. They continue to be blind to who He really is. Are we blind to Jesus and why He came? Bartimaeus cried out with the right words, expecting mercy, and was told to be quiet, yet kept crying out for mercy, until Jesus heard and answered him. We cannot be a servant until we receive healing from the Great Servant for whatever is holding us back from serving Jesus and what He would have us do. If you are a Bartimaeus, Jesus is here to serve and save you. Assisting today was Diana at the organ, reading Scripture, and leading the Children's Time by talking about "You Are a Whosoever".
