There were about six children who were 4- and 5-year-olds at the KUMC "Gone Fishing with Jesus" Vacation Bible School. By the way, VBS went great and thank you to all the volunteers, families, and children who participated! Half our group was in that preschool to kindergarten age range. I had been telling some children who were elementary school age and their older youth siblings to come back for Sunday School because we had something for them and plenty of room for more. I could not say that about the preschool to kindergarten age group. KUMC has not had a preschool – kindergarten Sunday School class for years now. Faye Crowe, one of our members asked if we could have a class. Seeing those children and knowing there was at least one ready to come for a class, I thought Faye Crowe had a wonderful idea. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15 NRSV). 

The pantry is open  $2^{\rm nd}$  Mondays from 10-11 AM and  $2^{\rm nd}$  Thursdays from 7-8 PM.

<u>Serving Meals to Kingsway Prison Ministry</u>: Karen Mooney is leading preparing a meal each month for this ministry. Please contact her if you can help or donate.

<u>US Disaster Response</u>: For United States disaster relief designate your gift to "UMCOR US Disaster Response: Advance #901670." For international disasters please designate your gift to "UMCOR International Disaster Response: Advance #982450."

<u>Mission Central Equipment for Caring</u>: The medical equipment loaner closet loans out and receive donations of (1) durable medical equipment like hospital beds, wheelchairs, walkers, canes, bedside commodes, etc. and (2) disposable supplies like adult diapers, briefs, and wound care items. They shared songs they had learned: "This Is the Day", "Great Big God", and "Jesus, Strong and Kind". Pastor Joel then spoke on "Welcoming Little Ones and the Kingdom of God" from Mark 10:1-16, the little children come to Jesus. Jesus was teaching and talking with all the people, answering questions. Some of them brought little children with them to see Jesus.
