OUR PASTOR CHATS

The 243rd session of the Virginia Annual Conference was June 12th-14th, and our clergy member was myself, Joel Robinette, and lay members were Jenn Robinette (from KUMC), Chris Cole (Shenandoah River District), and Wendell Cochran (District Lay Servant Coordinator). Wendell was unable to attend due to family illness. The music during worship was wonderful, we had an ordained deacon preside at the communion table for the first time at annual conference, and I particularly was blessed by the teaching from Rev Dr. Edgardo Colon-Emeric who shared on how Methodism has been a movement of the heart. A fun observation was how he noted John Wesley had an experience of grace where he felt his heart "strangely warmed." Edgardo noted that was probably significant in chilly England but in other parts of the world we may experience God's grace with a higher heat setting.

Here are a few notes on things that happened at conference. There is a fuller report, about eight pages, on the vaumc.org website. We recognized three new faith communities and charters. We heard information on just compensation for clergy. We voted on four constitutional amendments to the Book of Discipline. We celebrated the retirement of 39 pastors who had 1,044 years of combined service. We blessed people taking new steps in ministry: 18 for lay supply, 17 for Certified Lay Ministers, 15 Licensed Local Pastors, 8 Provisional Elders, 2 Associate Members, and 12 Ordained Elders. We closed 26 congregations in our conference. As of June 13th, \$42,000 was collected for the Conference Offering. There were 14,311 total Kits for Conference collected. Thank you to everyone who has been blessing the work of our Virginia Annual Conference in partnering with other UMC congregations, ministries, and mission; being lay servants and lay speakers, giving to the Conference Offering, and giving to Kits for Conference. Let's be in prayer for churches having a change in leadership this July, our own Shenandoah River District as Rev Kyungsuk Cho begins as our new District Superintendent, our Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson and the people and ministries of the Virginia Annual Conference. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, "mold us, fill us, use us. Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on us" ("Spirit of the Living God" by Dan Iverson). Amen.

<u>Gathering Non-Perishable Food items:</u> Drop off items at KUMC for our local food pantry. Non-perishable foods and hygiene items are welcome. Items are distributed through Massanutten Presbyterian Church for residents of Keezletown, Penn Laird, and McGaheysville. The pantry is open 2^{nd} Mondays from 10 - 11 AM and 2^{nd} Thursdays from 7 - 8 PM.

<u>Serving Meals to Kingsway Prison Ministry</u>: Karen Mooney is leading preparing a meal each month for this ministry. Please contact her if you can help or donate.

<u>D Day June 6th</u>: "Today marks the 81st anniversary of D-Day, when over 2,500 American lives were lost during the invasion and subsequent Battle of Normandy. Among the forces in the initial invasion were troops from the Shenandoah Valley, including members of the 116th Infantry, 29th Division of the Virginia National Guard. Major Tom Howie of Staunton served as the Regimental Operations Officer of the 116th Infantry and was responsible for safeguarding the D-Day Operation Plan. Other regiments also included troops from Rockingham County and the surrounding areas. Private Miller Williams of McGaheysville belonged to the 2nd Battalion of

the 501st Paratroop Regiment and was among the first Airborne Infantry troops to land on Normandy Beach. Like so many others that day, he lost his life in the battle and was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart. Induction and Discharge Records that tell the story of Rockingham County's many WWII soldiers, just like Williams, are housed here at the Rockingham Circuit Court's Historic Archives. On this anniversary, we encourage you to keep the soldiers who fought bravely in your hearts and remember their sacrifice. Special thanks to the 29th Division Museum in Verona for their assistance in sharing these stories." Tony Wilt

When she became ill, and singing was very hard for her, she wanted to try and sing one more time. Wesearched for the perfect song, and we found it in a song called "Lord Let Me Leave a Song. Thank you for all the prayers and loving kindness shown by the church family. She especially loved children, of all ages. When Barbara saw a child, she always saw the face of God. I pray when you heard Barbara sing that you felt closer to Jesus. I know that was always her prayer. The music in Barbara's life was feeble in comparison to the music of Heaven, that we will all get to sing someday if we remain faithful to God. As I think back

over the last few years, and speaking for my entire family, we thank God for the blessing of having a very loving church family led by a wonderful minister and shepherd.
